Course Description:

This course is aimed at students who wish to go into careers such as nursing, midwifery, paramedic science, radiography, social work, physiotherapy, occupational therapy, speech therapy and other health and social care related occupations. The course is equivalent to one A Level.

Course Content:

There are four units to study:

- Unit 1 Human Lifespan Development
- Unit 2 Working in Health and Social Care
- Unit 14 Physiological Disorders
- Unit 5 Meeting Individual Care and Support Needs

In addition to class work there are guest speakers, trips and practical activities. The Partnership works with Royal Stoke University Hospital and Staffordshire University to provide placement opportunities at Stafford and Stoke Hospitals. Successful work placement experience will aid progression to employment and university.

Additional Information BTEC suggest up to eight hours of independent study are required per week to support class work. Therefore, organization of work and time are fundamental to success. Students should enjoy working collaboratively with others to develop interpersonal and team work skills.

Entry requirements: A 9-4 in at least five different subjects, with a grade 4 or above in English and mathematics and a grade 5 in the subject to be studied. Please note that most university courses require a 5 or above/ A-C in math's and English as well as science.

Assessment: Units 1 and 2 are externally assessed. Units 5 and 14 are internally assessed. (One exam and one assignment per year).

Financial Information: It is highly recommended that a course text book and a course revision guide are purchased at a cost of approximately £40. Additional costs for trips and enrichment activities total no more than £30.

Future opportunities: Students may progress to university where there are a wide range of courses leading to careers in health or social care. This course would not be a recommended route for child care, primary school teaching, dentistry or medicine. Learners not wishing to go to university may













choose to develop their practical skills by training in the workplace and could apply of a Health & Social Care apprenticeship, or progress to employment as a care worker. Learners wishing to progress to midwifery, paramedic science or physiotherapy should take a science A level alongside the BTEC, as required by most universities.
